There is so much hate being evidenced in our world and nation in shootings, acts of terror and incredible vitriol directed for political ends. It is almost as if we've lost our human mind and become mindlessly brutish. We, however, as the scripture tells us have the mind of Christ, let us employ that mind in the imitation of Him who so loved the world that He gave His only Son for it. Let us speak the language of life and light to a troubled world that will bring a new time of renewal to God's cherished human race. During this month we will often hear the words; "God bless America." Let us indeed bless our nation and world with God's light and love in the beauty of the Gospel. Let us consistently represent Jesus Christ in the world that in us and through us people may see our Lord and so be moved to civility and peace. Let us so bless America.
