Dear Friends,

"Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right. Honour thy father and mother; which is the first commandment with promise; That it may be well with thee, and thou mayest live long on the earth."

Ephesians 6:1-3

On the 2015 calendar, May 10th is designated as Mother's Day. Mother's Day is a wonderful reminder of the great gift God has given us in our mothers. Our mothers gave birth to us, nourished us, taught us and loved us. For these reasons, God has given us the commandment to honor our mother, not only on Mother's Day, but always. For when we honor our parents, we honor the hidden God who loves us through our parents.

When we reflect upon the value of our mothers, we can find no better picture than that of Christ Himself: "Now there stood by the cross of Jesus his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus therefore saw his mother, and the disciple standing by, whom he loved, he saith unto his mother, Woman, behold thy son! Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy mother! And from that hour that disciple took her unto his own home." John 19:25-27

As far as we know, Joseph is no longer living at the time of Jesus' crucifixion. As the first-born son, it was Jesus' responsibility to take care of His mother. Jesus now entrusts the care of His mother to the disciple whom He loved (as John records in His Gospel). From that moment on, that disciple (most likely John himself) takes Mary into his own home. So now, even as Jesus is suffering on the Cross, even as He is bearing the sins of the whole world, even as He is about to die, Jesus is thinking of His dear mother.

As Jesus dies on the cross, He thinks not only of His mother, but all of us as well. "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Luke 23:34 It is the very nature of God, that He graciously bestows His favor upon us. God even uses motherhood as an illustration of His own love for us. Even when we stray because of sin, God reminds us that He will never leave us or forsake us. "But Zion said, The Lord hath forsaken me, and my Lord hath forgotten me. Can a woman forget her sucking child, that she should not have compassion on the son of her womb? yea, they may forget, yet will I not forget thee. Behold, I have graven thee upon the palms of my hands; thy walls are continually before me." Isaiah 49:14-16 It seems unlikely that a mother would ever forget her nursing child. As unlikely as that may seem, God assures us that it is not only unlikely, but impossible that He will ever forget us. God will always remember His children, because He has graven us in the palms of His hands. God has forgiven us, because of the wounds in the hands of His Son, Jesus. May God richly bless you through the merits of the crucified and Risen Lord, Jesus Christ.
