Dear Friends,

As God's people, we wait for Christ's return with great longing and rejoicing, as a bride awaits her bridegroom. As the composer Laurenti, Laurentius writes:

Our Hope and Expectation,
O Jesus, now appear;
Arise, thou Sun so longed for,
O'er this benighted sphere.
With hearts and hands uplifted,
We plead, O Lord to see
The day of earth's redemption
That brings us unto thee.
